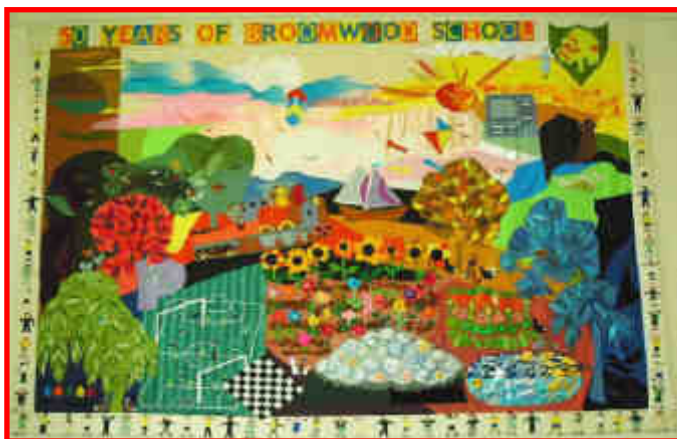

Youth Centre Update



After years of 'too-ing and frowning' it seems that we are, at long last, on the brink of something good happening to the Youth Centre. The building is beginning to look abandoned with virtually every one of its windows either broken or boarded up. But, after so many false dawns in the past, the thing we have learnt on Broomwood is not to 'hold our breath'

At the last meeting of the Broomwood Partnership we were still awaiting confirmation that the actual work planned is still possible to do as the initial tenders came in at £200,000 over budget. Subsequent revised tenders came closer but were still over the budget. It was agreed that further negotiations would be entered into by TMBC in the hope of securing an agreement with a developer as well as arranging as early as start date as possible. As always we will keep you informed of developments as they happen.
