Trafford Housing Trust recently held an open day at the Redbrook Road Office on the 27th July 2006 inviting tenants to sign their new Tenancy Agreements and also other THT service providers i.e.: Regeneration Team, Tenancy support, Repairs Team, Good Neighbour Unit and the Repairs Team. Tenants were invited to come along and discuss any issues/concerns they may have. Also in attendance was the local Fire Brigade who issued fire safety leaflets offering a free 10 year smoke alarm to all tenants/residents. Local children were able to look around the fire engine and try the firemen's helmets on. Claire Wheeler from Action for Sustainable Living provided a "**Blooming Potty Event**" workshop for local children and parents to paint the pots and pot the plants. Children and parents also made hanging baskets which they were able to take home. Plants and herbs not used were donated to Broomwood Primary School and Head teacher Ann Wood was very pleased with this donation. Trafford Housing Trust staff consulted with all tenants/residents in the flats in which they completed a questionnaire, this was then entered into a Prize Draw to win £20 of Argos Vouchers. This was drawn by Board member Eric Roberts at the Open Day and the winner was a Mrs. Jackson. 4 skips were also placed around the Redbrook Road, Bamford Gardens and Hartford Gardens area to encourage tenant participation from the tenants living in the flats. The day was a great success and Trafford Housing Trust will be looking at holding Open Days in other areas of Altrincham.
